

Rating Action: Moody's assigns Aaa to Carroll County, MD's GOULT bonds; outlook stable

New York, November 10, 2021 -- Moody's Investors Service has assigned Aaa rating to Carroll County, MD's \$22 million Public Improvement Bonds of 2021. Moody's maintains the Aaa rating on the county's outstanding general obligation unlimited tax (GOULT) debt. Following the sale, the county will have approximately \$302.8 million in outstanding GOULT debt. The outlook is stable.

RATINGS RATIONALE

The Aaa rating reflects the county's solid, growing tax base near the Baltimore (Aa2 stable) - Washington metropolitan area, above average resident wealth and income indices, and a healthy, stable financial position. The rating also incorporates the county's strong adherence to formal financial and debt policies, and manageable debt and pension liabilities.

RATING OUTLOOK

The stable outlook reflects the continued growth of the county's tax base, which derives stability from its location near the District of Columbia (Aaa stable) and the City of Baltimore. The outlook also factors in the county's healthy financial position and adherence to formal financial and debt policies, which will likely continue to support stable financial operations going forward.

FACTORS THAT COULD LEAD TO A DOWNGRADE OF THE RATING

- Material deterioration in taxable values or resident wealth and income indices
- Declines in general fund reserves and liquidity
- Increase in debt burden

LEGAL SECURITY

The Series 2021 bonds are secured by the county's full faith and credit pledge, payable from the county's ability to levy ad valorem taxes without limitation upon all assessable property within the county's boundaries.

USE OF PROCEEDS

The proceeds of the Series 2021 will finance a portion of costs related to various capital improvement projects, particularly for public works and education facilities.

PROFILE

Carroll County is located 30 miles northwest of Baltimore and 55 miles north of Washington D.C. in the north central part of Maryland (Aaa stable). Encompassing roughly 456 square miles, the county provides a wide range of municipal services, including education and public safety, to a population of about 172,891 in 2020.
