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| <u>Update on Veteran Services Program Grant</u> (Courtney Edwards) –Currently there are no Veterans in the hotels. The last one was able to get a full-time job and move in with a co-worker. There are 6 homeless Veterans in the shelters, one of which is eligible for the HUD VASH. The program has also been assisting with a variety of other needs, including paying up some utility bills for 2 families that had fallen behind. <u>Veterans View Column</u> – (Gina Valentine) – Nothing new to report. Still no response from the Carroll County Times. |
| <u>Elks Grant—Tablets for Veteran (Bobbie Lawrence for Sam Cangelosi)</u>—A handful of tablets have been distributed to Veterans in nursing homes and assisted living facilities. Now working on expanding to those who are homebound. The tablets are for the Veterans to keep, this is not a loaner program. If you know of someone who may be in need you can reach out to Bobbie Lawrence (rlawrence@carrollcountymd.gov) or Sam Cangelosi (samcangelosi1@hotmail.com) <u>Vehicles for Change (Gina Valentine/Celene Steckel)</u>—There are 10 vehicles available for Maryland, 2 of which are set aside for Carroll County, thanks to Commissioner Rothstein's efforts. Applications are due the end of September and vehicles will be presented on Veteran's Day. To be eligible, applicants must be working or have a job offer, be insurable, drug-free, have a valid MD driver's license, & there must be no vehicles in their household. There is a bit of a cost upfront (tax, title, license, small fee for car) that the Veteran Services Program |
| might be able to assist with. If you know of anyone who might be eligible, please refer to the BOAD for an application. <u>SOLES Program Coat Drive</u>—(Bobbie Lawrence for Ginger Turnball) This is a non-profit that is partnering with Boscov's to offer coats to those in need.
