	a. Commissioner Rothstein: Thank you for attending virtually. Be aware of winter weather and let Carroll
	County Government/Commissioners know if you see a need. Continue to promote the vaccine and
	we'll get through this together.
	5. <u>Public Comment</u> – No comment.
Old Business	1. A quorum (6 + voting members) was established with seven voting members present.
	2. <u>Approval of Minutes</u> – A motion was made by Bill Murphy and seconded by Elaine May Stem. A vote was taken
	and the minutes for the December 2021 meeting was approved.

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	vi. Monthly return on investment, based on known awards is approximately \$1,164,127 for
	compensation and pension. Monthly Growth Rate for the month of December 2021 was 1%.
	vii. Yearly return on investment, based on known awards is approximately \$42,823,474 since inception
	of the program in October 2013. Growth Rate from 12/2020 to 12/2021 is 31%.
	viii. Some claims are taking two years to process. Francine was working with a veteran who filed in
	2020, prior to the pandemic. VA lost the claim. They just now received \$111,000 from the VA in
	back pay. This will be reflected in next month's report.
	ix. Of the new representations, some are referred, and some make contact themselves. Commissioner
	Rothstein would like to start looking at the trends of new representations so we can market the
	program by those same means.

	5. Martinsburg – 6 Veterans served with 8 trips
	6. Total cost - \$2,970.45
	ii. They are shuttling a veteran who is going every day to dialysis. Winter is a slower time of year.
	c. <u>Employment Initiatives for Veterans Update</u> (John Veney) – No report.
	. <u>Update on Veteran Direct Home and Community Based Services Program Grant</u> (Francine Hahn) – Currently
	serving two families.
	. <u>Update on Veteran Services Program Grant</u> (Courtney Edwards) – The program is working with four veterans
	with HUD VASH vouchers and one with a mainstream voucher. Currently one veteran is in the hotel and two
	veterans have found units. Also, continuing to assist with paperwork and items needed for their new homes.
New Business	. <u>COAD is Seeking a Veteran Representative</u> (Celene Steckel) – Elaine May Stem is interested. Celene will email her
	the application and position description.

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	2. <u>Frequency of Meetings</u> (Marc Fisher) – While meeting virtually, change the meeting frequency to every other
	month. Elaine May Stem, Steve Whisler and Bill Murphy agree. Reports will be emailed monthly to the list serv.
	When the county agrees to return to in-person meetings then VAC will go back to meeting monthly. No
	objections were raised.
	3. <u>Veterans Round Up</u> (Commissioner Weaver) – There is concern that younger veterans (30-50 years of age) are
	unaware of the Veteran Services Program and are not becoming members of local Veteran Services
	Organizations, which parallels the mission of the Veterans Advisory Council and Program. Commissioner Weaver
	is interested in organizing an event celebrating veterans and providing information on Veteran services in Carroll
	County. Thoughts include Sunday afternoon, Farm Museum, Petting Zoo, playground, inflatables, food, beer
	garden with various Veteran organizations having booths set up to provide information on their organization. In
	addition, there would be a program and possible guests such as Secretary Owings, Ravens, etc. Marc asked for
	volunteers – Bob Eney, Mick Schmidt, Elaine May Stem, Commissioner Weaver, Kristen Maszarose. Kristen noted
	that Carroll Community College has a lot of young veterans attending. Celene Steckel, Gina Valentine and Bobbie
	Lawrence would like to be present at the first planning meeting. Commissioner Weaver will reach out to Jack
	Lyburn about marketing and Marc to contact Joanne Wendt for Farm Museum availability. This would be fully
	funded with sponsors. We need to recognize community partners that would bring veterans and active duty to
	the event. Add to the tourism newsletter and coordinate media sponsorships.
Announcements	1. Scott Swartz from Habitat for Humanity provided information on their Critical Home Repair program.
	2. Bill Murphy announced that he is working with Mudgett Auto Body and Charles Wheatley to donate a car to a
	local veteran who is 100% service disabled. He also received a donation of a \$64,000 power chair.
	3. Steve Whisler announced that Tricare and VA Medical recipients are not eligible for the eight COVID home tests
	per person per month insurance reimbursement. Currently the reimbursement is available for commercial
	insurance carriers. According to the President's plan, those with underlying health conditions (with a doctor's
	order) can get unlimited reimbursement per month (up to \$12 for each test) when filing through their civilian
	insurance company.
	4. The website is open to order 4 free home COVID tests. There is a limit of four per household/address. Website is
	www.covidtests.gov or https://special.usps.com/testkits.

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	5. Celene announced that the state is accepting applications for the Maryland Homeowner Assistance Fund to help
	homeowners struggling to pay their mortgage due to COVID. Visit the website to apply and find more
	information on eligibility https://dhcd.maryland.gov/residents/pages/homeownerassistancefunds.aspx . Carroll
	County still has funding available for those who are behind on their rent due to COVID. You can apply at HSP.
