GENERATOR INSTALLMENTS

unsafe back-up generators, while performing their normal inspection duties. Mr. Yingling confirmed that the inspectors encounter unsafe electrical installations on a daily basis, and they are addressed accordingly.

STATE LICENSING


Mr. Yingling indicated to the board as a formal reminder, to advise as many parties and employers that all employees are required to be licensed by the State of Maryland by the end of 2022. It was also conveyed that the "grandfathering" clause for journeymen will expire on December 31, 2022.

CODE ADOPTION


Carroll County is going to attempt to implement the 2020 Electrical Code on January 1, 2023. Mr. Yingling informed the Board the proposal for adoption of a new code would have to go before the Commissioners for approval. Mr. Yingling suggested the Board to review the bylaws for any amendments.
