Issue: FY24 Maryland Shelter and Transitional Housing Facilities Capital Grant (STHFGP)

Background: In operation for 30 years, the County's Family Shelter in Westminster does not provide a safe environment for some of the County's most vulnerable – homeless children and their families. Over the last four years, 306 adults and 243 children have been served in shelter; the shelter typically operates at capacity with a wait list. The current shelter does not provide adequate space and there are significant concerns about safety, accessibility, and the lack of child-friendly spaces. In 2021, the County purchased a building on Stoner Ave. in Westminster in order to relocate the Family Shelter.

Impact: The MD Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) offers funding annually for renovations of emergency shelters. The grant will fund up to 75% of construction expenses and is one of three grants that can be utilized for the renovation of the Family Shelter.

Executive Summary:

The Carroll County Sheriff's Office, in coordination with Management and Budget staff, requests your approval to lease additional space at the former North Carroll High School. In addition, the CCSO requests your approval for one-time improvements and options for lease payments.

Background:

The building was sold in December of 2021 and the Sheriff's Office started a long-term lease for most of the space on the lower level (approximately 18,000 sq feet). With the County moving forward with Fire/EMS, the current facilities at Kate Wagner are going to be renovated for their use, requiring the CCSO to move to another location. There is additional space available adjacent to the existing leased space at North Carroll, which can be incorporated into the existing lease. The additional square footage will provide enough space for the equipment and items that need to be moved. There are minimal one-time updates to the space that will be needed. In addition, the landlord is open to several payment options, listed below.

Staff Recommended Motion:

Executive Summary: The Department of Technology Services is requesting permission to provide letters of support and the requested matching dollars to Quantum Telecommunications and Verizon. Both Internet Service Provers (ISP's) are submitting grant applications to the Office of State Broadband for the Network Infrastructure program. In order for the County to authorize the use of Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (LFRF) as match, the county publicly posted a Request for Proposals and received two responses. Both applications have been reviewed by the Department of Technology Services and the Grants Office and both meet the requirements set forth by the County and the State.

If selected by the State, the proposed funded service area (PFSA) will provide broadband for up to xxxx unserved households located in several rural areas, in the County The selected ISP will be responsible for the entirety of the project, including construction of the new service areas, and will own and operate the network once installation is complete.

With the Board's approval, funding for the County match will be met by using the county's Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (FRF)already allocated for expansion of broadband in Carroll County.

The Office of Procurement, in cooperation with the Bureau of Facilities, requests your approval to award the removal and replacement of all cooling equipment in the IT room, consisting of 4 APC Units at the New Windsor Library Headquarters to Graybar, under the Omnia Partners Contract #EV2370 in the amount of \$346,959.72.

This amount is approved in the FY23 budget, and no additional funds should be required.

Background: We are here today for the approval to award Graybar the contract to purchase and install 4 APC HVAC units for the data room at the Library Headquarters.
