Volunteers provide friendly visitation and serve as advocates for residents. As a Volunteer Ombudsman, you will be trained to advocate, help to promote residents' rights, and enhance the quality of life of long term care residents.

Responsibilities of Ombudsman Volunteers:

- · Visit with residents residing in nursing homes or assisted living facilities
- Provide information to residents about their rights
- Identify, investigate, and resolve complaints made by or on behalf of residents
- Advocate for changes to improve residents' quality of life and care
- Adhere to confidentiality policies required under federal law

Qualifications / Requirements:

- 21 years of age
- Successfully complete required training
- Complete an interview
- A good listener
- Able to communicate effectively, both in writing and verbally
- Sensitive to older adults and their needs
- Open-minded and non-judgmental
- Tactful and diplomatic
- Able to work on a complaint/problem until it is thoroughly investigated and resolved or explained to the satisfaction of the resident
- Able to work as part of a team
- Minimum one year commitment requested
- Perform 4 hours of volunteer work per week
