## County Commissioners Approve Nine Transfers to Recreation and Parks Self-Help Projects

**Westminster, MD, Thursday, October 12, 2017** – Today, the Board of Carroll County Commissioners (BCC) voted unanimously to transfer \$79,837 from the Community Self Help fund to nine recreation council projects. Self-Help funds appropriated in the FY 18 Capital Budget, along with funds remaining from previously closed projects, are sufficient to cover the county's portion of funding for the new projects.

Projects were previously presented and approved by the Recreation and Parks Advisory Board and were submitted today requesting combined recreation council and county funding to move forward:

The Self-Help Program was developed in the mid-1970's by the County Commissioners in an effort to create community interest and involvement in the improvement of recreational facilities throughout Carroll County. To achieve this goal, the county established a capital fund, which can be used by recreation councils. To qualify for these funds, the recreation council's prospective project must meet certain requirements and the recreation council must provide monetary and, where applicable, volunteer hour contributions for its development.
