**Westminster, Monday May 8, 2017** – The Carroll County Board of Commissioners is proud to participate in a Memorial Day Remembrance Ceremony at 2:00 pm. on May 27, 2017 at Gerstell Academy. Governor Bob Ehrlich will also participate in the ceremony as a guest speaker. Since WWI, nearly 9,000 Marylanders have paid the ultimate sacrifice in honor of our country.

The Memorial Day Remembrance activities will begin on Friday, May 26, 2017, when 9,000 United States flags will be planted on the lawn of Gerstell Academy in honor of those nearly 9,000 Marylanders who gave their lives for our freedom. They will remain available for the public to visit through Monday, May 29th.
