There is a reception today for Gail's retirement in the Senior Center's dining room from 2-4pm. At 1:45pm she will be reading a proclamation from the Governor and from 3-4pm will lead a forum on seniors volunteering in their community. Bob, Gail and Lauren volunteered to man a booth that will give information on volunteering on the Commission. Having an article in the Carroll County Times was discussed that would introduce the members of the Commission as well as highlight area in BOAD that are of value to the public. Photographs would be provided that would give the public a face to those that are representing them in their area. In a few months the State Department of Aging will begin another call list of area seniors needing someone to check in on them.
