**In Carroll County a Non-Refillable Container Permit entitles the Permit Holder to sell draft beer for consumption off the licensed premises in a non-refillable container (Crowler) that meets the following standards under Alcoholic Beverages Article 4-1106**

**LEGAL REQUIREMENTS:**

1. Crowlers must be constructed out of aluminum.
2. Crowlers must be sealable.
3. Crowlers must have a capacity of 32 ounces.
4. Crowlers must be branded with the identifying marks of the seller of the container.

**LABELING:**

The label on each growler must:

1. Be branded with an identifying mark of the seller of the container;
2. Bear the federal health warning statement required for containers of alcoholic beverages under Alcoholic Beverages Articles 27 C.F.R. 16.21;

**HOURS OF SALE:**

Except as otherwise specifically provided, the hours of sale for a refillable container permit are the same as those for the underlying alcoholic beverages license.

The specific provision for hours of sale state that sales “begin at the same time as those for the underlying alcoholic beverages license; and end at midnight”. Class A establishments’ hours of sale end at 11:00 p.m.
